We are slowly approaching November, a month dedicated to remembering the Deceased. Each of us, without exception, will someday pass through the threshold of death. It behooves us then, as pilgrims on this earth, to always remember that Jesus referred to Himself as "the Way, the Truth, and the Life" (J 14,6).

they will be shown mercy" (Mt 5: 7). And one of the first works of mercy is prayer for the souls of the Departed!

A prayer for the deceased is our duty. Church Tradition has always urged prayer for the deceased. It is the best spiritual help that we can give to their souls. Think about the dear ones

who passed away, especially those who you miss: <u>parents</u>, <u>brothers</u>, <u>sisters</u>, <u>spouse</u>, <u>children</u>, <u>friends</u>... <u>and many others who have fallen asleep in Christ. Maybe they are waiting for your prayers</u>. If you beseech Heaven for them, the overabundance of your prayers for their intentions will be passed on to other needy <u>souls</u>. No prayer will be wasted. Remember that every deceased who you help to reach Heaven, may one day become like a magnet that will draw you there.

Your generous free will offering will earn you graces in heaven, because you are contributing to good work: to preach the teachings of the Church on the airwaves and the Internet. The existence and continuance of the Father Justin Rosary Hour is only possible through people like you.
